History has always had great people.

- Nations rise and fall on the shoulders of its warriors people who refuse to accept things as they are and they have their own vision for the future and are willing to pay whatever price to see it fulfilled!
- There is still room in our culture for warriors. In fact, current culture demands warriors for Christ those willing to bring the kingdom of God into the kingdoms of men.
- Rick Warren suggests we still need individuals willing to help and free people around us. He suggests five qualities are needed as warriors of Christ:

Let's look at the ways of these earliest Christian warriors:

- 1. They prayerfully turned to God when finding themselves in a defensive position.
 - They immediately sought the identity and strength of their own.
 - See v24: They begin their prayer: "Sovereign Lord" (despotes)
 - God's control over all things is the foundational to all meaningful prayer.
 - The question: Can you release yourself to this kind of trust?
 - David in Adullam (refuge): Psalm 142
- 2. They made their decision of courage: they prayed for courage and then made the decision to exercise courage!
 - They prayed for boldness to return to their mission.
 - Their commitment was not to the masses, not the themselves, not to numerical growth and cultural understanding; *their commitment was to the message!*
