Life Enrichment

- Of the five "Principles of Genuine Community" mentioned in this week's teaching, which do you find easiest to live? Which is most difficult? Why?
- Why do you think serving together is one of the best ways to build community within a church? How have you experienced this?
- Spend some time in prayer. After listening to the Holy Spirit, list the ways He is leading you to participate in helping to build community at Maranatha.

Genuine community is the natural byproduct of being loved by God and loving Him fully in return. According to 1 John 4:8, 19, "God is love" and "we love each other/others because He first loved us." Since love's most fundamental quality is to seek the good of others, genuine community is other-centered, serving, sacrificial love found in relationships.

Key Points

- Genuine community is a place that is profoundly safe.
 - o A place where we learn to live with nothing hidden, daring to be open and vulnerable, knowing that we will be loved more, not less for it.
 - o 1 John 1:7 "If we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another..."
- Genuine community is a place where we never give up on each other.
 - o Protection always trumps accountability.
 - o Shame is banished in the acknowledgment of who we are in Christ (Ro 8:1).
- Genuine community is a place where wisdom about how to live emerges from conversation (Lk 24:13-35).
- Genuine community is a place where we embrace the reality of "many hands."
 - o We all matter. We all pitch in. We all contribute.
 - We all use our gifts and abilities to partner with God in His redemptive/reconciling work.
- Genuine community develops as we meet together, share openly, pray fervently, love sincerely, receive and respond to biblical teaching, give and serve generously, and grow in trust toward God and each other.
