# **Core Value 4 - We Highly Value Holistic Generosity**

Holistic generosity is a grateful response to God's loving generosity toward us. That means that generosity is more than giving finances. It includes generosity of time, abilities, resources, encouragement, and gratitude. Generosity is present when we advocate for justice, act compassionately, and offer hospitality. It is done without respect to receiving a reward or a return. God is generous toward us, and in turn, we are generous with others in tangible ways.

## **Key Points**

## **Key Scriptures**

- **Deuteronomy 10:17-18** For the LORD your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality and accepts no bribes. He defends the cause of the fatherless and the widow, and loves the foreigner residing among you, giving them food and clothing.
- **Deuteronomy 15:7-8, 10-11** If anyone is poor among your fellow Israelites in any of the towns of the land the LORD your God is giving you, do not be hardhearted or tightfisted toward them. Rather, be openhanded and freely lend them whatever they need... Give generously to them and do so without a grudging heart; then because of this the LORD your God will bless you in all your work and in everything you put your hand to. There will always be poor people in the land. Therefore, I command you to be openhanded toward your fellow Israelites who are poor and needy in your land.
- **Proverbs 19:17** Whoever is kind to the poor lends to the LORD, and he will reward them for what they have done.
- **Hebrews 13:16** And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased.
- **James 1:27** Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.
