#### Life Enrichment

## **Explanation**

Since the fall of humanity into sin (Ge 3), God has been on a mission to reconcile people to Himself and each other. In the ultimate act of love, God paid the ransom to redeem us from our sin. Now He invites His followers to partner with Him, bringing the good news to their community, region, and to the ends of the earth.

## **Key Points**

- God so loved sinful humanity arrayed in rebellion against Him that He sent His only son to rescue them (Jn 3:16-17).
- As God sent Jesus, so, Jesus sends His followers to advance His redemptive purposes (Jn 20:21-22).
- God's redemptive purpose is conducted as His followers live gospel transformed lives and proclaim the good news in our communities.
- Partnering with God in His redemptive mission shifts the focus of the church from being "About us for us" to being "About them for Him."
- God's redemptive mission is best accomplished in meaningful relationships with those who do not yet believe and is demonstrated in radical Christian love and holistic generosity.
- God's redemptive mission must be conducted in the power of the Holy Spirit.
